IT'S ON!!! OHAG MEMBERS JURIED SHOW 2021

Calling all Olive Hyde Art Guild artists! The OHAG website is now set up for the Members Juried Show with online entry, uploading of images, payment by PayPal or check, and prospectus with rules of the show.

We are pleased to announce that the Juror for the 2021 Show will be independent art curator Marianne McGrath. After a successful decade with New Museum Los Gatos and The Museums of Los Gatos curating exhibits and presenting art and education programs, Marianne founded MKM Art Consulting, LLC. Marianne holds a BA degree in Art and MA degree in Art History. COF Recreation Supervisor Gloria Kim will do the 3-month Olive Hyde Art Gallery MJS exhibit virtually. The Gallery remains closed due to the Coronavirus.

Artists must enter online at www.olivehydeartguild.org by submission **deadline Tuesday, June 8**. Remote judging will be mid-June and email notification will begin June 17. Gloria Kim is planning the Virtual MJS exhibit to include a mix of things to entertain viewers: online voting for People's Choice Award; an opening reception to present awards - Best of Show, 2nd & 3rd Place, Merit Awards; a gallery to view all the 2- and 3-dimensional artwork and perhaps to purchase art; art-talk with the juror and honored artists.... and more!

While membership in the Guild is a requirement of participation, new members are welcome! Thanks to the MJS team, led by Judy Anglin, and committee members Susan Longini, Sue Saracco, and Lisa Stambaugh.

EXCITING SERRA CENTER ART WORKSHOP NEWS!!!

About 20 Serra Center artists will soon take part in the 11th SC Art Workshop via Zoom in their respective homes. The one hour art class will be held at 2pm on Thursdays, beginning April 22 and ending June 10. The eight week program is sponsored and funded by OHAG. Serra Center Development Manager Leslie McGarry and COF-Recreation Services Supervisor Gloria Kim partner to organize and schedule the entire art workshop. COF-Rec Art Instructor Susan Bettencourt has planned a varied curriculum for the SC artists to include watercolor, acrylics, colored pencil and ceramics. Gloria Kim has ordered all the necessary art supplies and will oversee delivery so that each artist/student will have his or her own materials required for the program. Good luck to all the SC artists and congratulations to Serra Center, COF-Recreation Services and OHAG for their successful collaborative efforts!

One Ocean, 45 artists: International art quilt group exhibit probes the Pacific

Olive Hyde Art Gallery is pleased to announce the premiere of ***Shifting Tides: Convergence in Cloth*** by Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) from **April 5th to June 27th**. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Olive Hyde Art Gallery will begin exhibiting the show virtually and possibly in-person – details to follow.

Created as a group exhibit to shine a light on the issues facing the Pacific Ocean today, *Shifting Tides* is a collection of work by 45 artists chosen from the seven Pacific-facing regions of Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA). An international organization that promotes the quilt as an art form, SAQA has a history of inviting artists to explore topical, sometimes controversial topics. With this latest show, the organization’s west-coast members explore the earth’s largest ecosystem.

Our Scholarship Program is underway with high school and Ohlone College students encouraged to apply. The Guild is offering a virtual program this month on “Sketching for Everyone”. And the list goes on.....

I am so proud of the Guild and the way it has persevered through the pandemic. I see only exciting days and times ahead! And, I hope, you do, too. What can you do to be part of the vision for the future? First, of course, is to maintain your membership in the Guild. Second, consider becoming more involved by volunteering to serve in some capacity. Three, if you are able, make a tax-deductible donation to the Guild. And fourth, tell your friends about the Guild and encourage them to join.
