Olive Hyde Art Center and Gallery! What a gem we have here in Mission San Jose!!!

It was an amazing backdrop for the Friday night opening reception of OHAG's Members Juried Show. In the charming courtyard people were treated to the ever popular wine bar, sweets & savories at the food tables, live music on the terrace by NSQ saxophone quartet, and a very lively social scene of guild members, artists, their friends & family, and people from around the community. Everyone came to see the wonderful art of 40 talented OHAG artists exhibited inside the lobby and three rooms of the Gallery. Amazing!!!

Who do we thank, who do we honor for this treasure of an art center in our community? Looking around the Olive Hyde Art Center and Gallery I often think about the woman whose name it bears, her generous gift to Mission San Jose, entrusting its care to the City of Fremont. Some of you may not be familiar with the history, and that ... "Olive Hyde is a real person, not just the name of a building." words from Cecilia Weed.

In 1935, over 80 years ago, a woman by the name of Olive Hyde from a wealthy prominent family in San Francisco moved to Mission San Jose and bought various properties. She had a dignified and gracious manner, was a business woman with a strong personality, an accomplished violinist musician, historian, early environmentalist and antique dealer. In the 1940's she purchased the Boulder Saloon on the corner of Mission and Washington Boulevards, had the saloon removed and hired noted architect Butler Sturdyvant to design two buildings, one to be her residence, the other for a gift shop & tearoom. In 1962 Olive Hyde donated the buildings to the city of Fremont, to be used for cultural and recreational purposes. After many generous and significant contributions to the city, in 1968 Olive Hyde moved back to San Francisco, never to return to Fremont. She passed away 1987 at the age of 101.

Olive Hyde gave the buildings to the city and in the words of Bob McIvor spoken to me some years ago before he passed away, "If someone gives something to you --- you should take care of it. " The Guild strives to honor that with its support of this wonderful city of Fremont art center and gallery, having contributed over the years to many upgrades and enhancements.

Thank you Olive Hyde for the Olive Hyde Art Center and Gallery! We are grateful!!!

APRIL PROGRAM: ASSEMBLAGE WITH MICHAEL SUNZERI THUR, APRIL 27TH 10 AM TO 1PM AT THE MISSION ROOM

Michael is a San Jose native. He always had his fingers in something to do with art, realizing there were no rules. He started assembling and modifying model cars at age 8. By age 12 he became enamored with different artistic styles of lettering and simple drawing. By high school he was well into different art techniques both in painting and collage, but he became extremely interested in drafting. After serving in the Navy, he landed work as an electro/mechanical Draftsman, later becoming a designer, mainly in Circuit Board Technology.

He later spent 22 years attending almost every local college in Santa Clara County, graduating from San Jose State with two Art related degrees. His main interest then was ceramics, both wheel and hand building, and also painted with acrylics and enamel and did som photography too. In all these endeavors, his tutoring came from some of the best local artists. Robert Strini, Dave Ogle, Clayton Bailey, and Kathy McBride to name a few. Dali has always been his biggest inspiration while he embraced a minimalist and asymmetrical mindset, straying from both at times. Having been trained in Pottery, Painting, and Photography, his concentration now is Assemblage. Gathering all artistic past knowledge, he applies it to spending an inordinate amount of time thinking of his next piece. Much of his work can be hung on walls, on the floor free standing, or placed on tabletops, even small jewelry.

4. These days what is your biggest challenges?






