The de Young Open 2023 is the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco's second triennial juried community art exhibition, featuring work by artists from the nine Bay Area counties. The show will run from **September 30, 2023 through January 7, 2024 at the de Young Museum in Golden Gate Park in San Francisco**. Over 800 pieces have been selected for the show from over 7,700 entries. Artworks will be hung salon-style and installed nearly edge to edge and floor to ceiling in the de Young museum's Herbst Exhibition Galleries, maximizing the number of works on view.



OHLONE COLLEGE ART WALK

The Ohlone College Art Walk tour is a self-guided tour of the public art at Ohlone College. It is supported by a navigational website and QR codes that link to audio interviews of students talking about their work. Ceramics Professor Katie Frank worked with students to create the work and with and Multi-Media Professor Isabel Reichert on the website.





At the end of last semester, the self-guided Art Walk on Ohlone College's Fremont Campus was launched. We hope that you will explore the campus and be delighted by the many site-specific sculptures and installations. Perhaps you'll run into a rat eating corn on the cob when you are looking at the lamp post inspired by Jean-Michel Basquiat or a tree with ceramic birds hanging from it near the Folk Art of India murals. Stop by the ceramic flowers to see flowers in all shapes and colors – even a flower that has grown into a pizza. We hope you are inspired to slow down when you see the large-scale ceramic snail and you take the time to explore the public art made by Ohlone College's Art Students on the Fremont campus.

Introducing COF Assistant Supervisor Vanessa Yung


