Her artwork has been shown in New York at the Untitled Space, PULSE Miami with Treat Gallery, internationally in South Korea at the CICA Museum and online with PxP Contemporary. She enjoys using playful subject matter to address complex topics including women's issues, mental health, joy and being.

She was awarded a Certificate of Honor from the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors in October 2020 for painting uplifting murals in the city's COVID overflow hospital space in the Presidio.

With this collection Ingrid is painting about the journey of radical self-compassion. She is responding to her personal puzzles with the aim of inspiring you to greet your challenges with curiosity. Her paintings serve as a visual respite for joyful rebellion in the face of obstacles.

THE JAN SCHAFIR ART AWARD

We are pleased to announce **The Jan Schafir Art Award** - an annual scholarship through the Olive Hyde Art Guild. This award will honor Jan's legacy and dedication to arts education by providing financial assistance to students who are passionate about pursuing higher education in the field of art.

The scholarship amount will be a \$1000 awarded to a single winner each year between 2024 and 2033. The recipient will be honored at the Scholarship Reception each year. The 2024 Scholarship Reception will be on Friday, May 17th.

Our immense gratitude to the Schafir family for bestowing this generous award and trusting the Guild with its administration.



Janice Kathryn Schafir was born on August 3rd, 1936, and passed away on March 10, 2022 at her home in Fremont-the city where she lived for over sixty years.

With pediatrician Michael Schafir, Jan raised four children. She volunteered for many Fremont organizations including hospice, the Red Cross, Fremont/Niles Rotary and Temple Beth Torah.

But her passion was art. Her own paintings record the natural beauty she found in her back yard and on her extensive travels. She studied with several famous painters and then shared her talent by teaching at Jan's Art Studio, Yosemite, and on cruise ships around the world. Many local artists credit Jan as a primary inspiration and role model. She helped to found what is now the Fremont Art & Wine Festival— just one example of the many ways she helped artists show and promote their artwork in the area. She had a rare kindness, and no canvas is large enough to capture all of her light.

As every painting is unique, so every burgeoning artist that Jan inspired has a story about how she touched their life. But each one of these stories recounts her ever-present smile and her unconditional acceptance of the art they wanted to create. We hope that the Jan Schafir Art Award serves to sustain some of her joyful influence.

Did you know: The largest statue in the world is the Mount Rushmore National Memorial which took 14 years to complete.
