

UPCOMING: MARCH PROGRAM LEGAL PROTECTION OF YOUR ART

Thursday, March 21, 2024 - 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Mission Room, Olive Hyde Art Center

Are you a working artist navigating the challenges of copyright law and Artificial Intelligence (AI)? The upcoming Olive Hyde Art Guild program on March 21, 2024 will explore issues such as:

- Is there a legal framework for intellectual property governing art used for Algenerated art usage, ownership, rights?
- How do I secure proof as the originator of my art? Should I add watermarks, or do I
 need to consider new software programs like Nightshade that scramble pigments and
 other aspects of my work to prevent it being "scraped" without permission?
- A federal judge ruled that copyright is based on people, and therefore Al-generated cannot be copyrighted. Still, how can I copyright and protect my original (non Al) artistry/art? Do I need to consult a legal professional?
- How do we appraise the value of Al-generated art?
- Can Al work to my advantage?
- Is Al easily learned and can it be incorporated in my creativity?
- What can we do to prevent Al misuse and ensure equitable compensation for Alenhanced work?
- How can I copyright and protect the art and my identity to it after I pass away?


Come assuage your fear of the unknown and learn some practical tips to protect your art and artistry. We have lined up a panel of experts to share their experience and answer your questions.
