

2024 ARTS LEADERSHIP AWARD RECIPIENTS

Judy Anglin is the Arts Leadership Award recipient for District One of the Alameda County Board of Supervisors. Judy is a long-time Board Member and dedicated Volunteer of the Olive Hyde Art Guild (OHAG) which was founded in 1972. Judy has been a cornerstone of the OHAG, championing its mission to support the City of Fremont's Olive Hyde Art Gallery and promoting the visual arts within schools and throughout the Fremont community. For over 40 years, Judy has been an active volunteer and has held numerous positions on the Board of Directors, including three years as Board President. Currently, Judy leads a talented team in orchestrating the Guild's annual holiday fundraiser which is now in its 40th year. Judy also plays a vital role in fundraising by gaining sponsors, grant support, and donations. She collaborates on the annual Serra Center Art Workshop for developmentally disabled adults, and leads the Guild's bi-annual



Members Juried Show. A talented watercolor artist herself, Judy takes particular pride in the Guild's efforts to provide art supplies, awards, and books to underserved children, youth, and seniors, enriching their lives through the power of art. Judy's unwavering commitment ensures the successful continuation of this important organization and the appreciation for the visual arts.



Dmitry Grudsky is one of two Arts Leadership Award recipients for District Two of the Alameda County Board of Supervisors. Dmitry is a Newark Visual Artist, Art Instructor and Community Volunteer working with many local groups and arts organizations in Alameda County. Dmitry specializes in watercolor painting and mosaic art. He has created an extensive number of mosaic tile public artworks for public schools, organizations and community spaces in Hayward, Fremont, Livermore, and Berkeley. With his paintings exhibited locally, nationally and internationally, he has received signature member status at several prestigious art associations including the Society of West Coast Artists, Northwest Watercolor Society, and California Watercolor Society. He continues to develop new ways to share his art and to encourage others to make art with the goal of positive change in our community.


UPCOMING: "CONNECTING CUTS: A PAPERCUT EXHIBITION"



Show Statement:

The phrase "pulling threads" metaphorically refers to the act of examining or unraveling the interconnected elements of a complex system or situation. It implies delving into the underlying structure woven from hundreds or thousands of threads that make up a larger whole, often with the intention of understanding its intricacies or revealing hidden connections. In the context of RoCoCo's exhibition entitled **Pulling Threads**, it suggests an exploration of the underlying themes, narratives, and shared conversations that have prompted the various projects they have produced over the years.

This exhibition brings together a core group of works encouraging viewers to seek and unveil the hidden connections between materiality and meaning.

Artist Bio:

Dr. KC Rosenberg and Modesto Covarrubias began collaborating in 2015, and formally launched RoCoCo in 2017. Early on they realized that when working together the potential for possible creative outcomes was greatly multiplied; indeed, two heads were better than one. RoCoCo's practice is a dialog of making, and each project begins with a conversation that continues as the work is produced. RoCoCo's work has been shown at Saddleback College in Mission Viejo, Idora Park Project Space in Oakland, and at Montalvo Arts Center in Saratoga, among other venues. RoCoCo were also artists-in-residence at the San Jose Museum of Quilts & Textiles in 2017. Dr. Rosenberg lives and works in Alameda, CA. Covarrubias lives in Berkeley and maintains a studio in West Oakland, CA. They both teach at California College of the Arts in San Francisco.


