

MISS OLIVE HYDE: A LEGACY OF ART & COMMUNITY

Miss Olive Hyde A Legacy of Art & Community

Tri-Cities Women's Club May 20, 2025



At the request of the Tri-Cities Women's Club, Lisa Stambaugh researched and created a presentation about the life of Miss Olive Hyde. Miss Olive was a Fremont resident and philanthropist with a deep appreciation for the arts and education, and of course our wonderful gallery and art center is named after her! The presentation covers in detail her 30-year stay in Fremont, the various buildings and residences she owned, her many community contributions, and her deep influence in the Mission San Jose area and beyond.

MAY WORKSHOP ON NEEDLE-FELTED APPLIQUÉ WITH BETHANY MANN

Eight enthusiastic attendees gathered for a lively mini-workshop on needle-felted applique, led by longtime Bay Area artist and instructor Bethany Mann. With over a decade of experience in fiber arts and book/papercrafts, Bethany guided us through the process of creating charming 4" x 5" felt mini-banners.

Using wool roving and reveling yarn, participants brought their designs to life with rich textures and playful color. Designs featured hearts, flowers, mushrooms, bees, and more! Bethany also introduced a few simple stitches for edging and embellishment, and treated us to her stash of vintage glass baubles and tassels for the finishing touches.

It was a fun and fuzzy way to flex our creative muscles!
